WAIVER FORMS: all horse event competitors are required to submit a completed and signed horse waiver form in order to be eligible to compete at Walgett Show. Waiver forms for minors must be signed by a legal guardian and PIC numbers are also required. Competitors will be issued with a wristband to indicate that they have submitted their horse waiver form and are eligible to compete. ***If competitors do not wear a wrist band, they cannot compete.*** Walgett Show Society appreciates the cooperation of competitors and horse waiver forms will be available from the mobile office at the Show, from the Show office prior to the Show, can be emailed by request and are also available from the ASC website: click on 'Horse Waiver' under 'Downloads' at the ASC website (www.agshowsnsw.org.au).

WALGETT SHOW DISTRICT - The Walgett Show District Shall comprise the Walgett Shire. To be eligible for local events, all exhibits and exhibitors must reside for three months within the Walgett Show District immediately prior to the Show (except students whose parental home is in the District).

Late entries will not be accepted. Entries must be in accordance with the regulations and conditions governing each section. Entries must be accompanied by entry fees, amounts of which are stated below in each section.

PRIZE MONEY - Prize money will be paid after each event by the Steward, unless stated. Others will be paid on presentation of the Steward's vouchers at the Secretary's Office at the Show, or the Mobile Office, if specified. All prize money and trophies are GST inclusive and must be collected by 30 June or revert to Walgett Show Society Inc.

1. Shall forward any changes to their section to the Show Secretary prior to completion of the Schedule.
2. Swabbing of horses may be done at any time at the discretion of the Ringmaster, Judges or Stewards.
3. Shall attend to the reception, classification, numbering thereof.
4. No Steward, being an exhibitor in the Section of which he/she is a Steward, shall be present with or near the Judge when the exhibit in which he/she is interested, is being judged.
5. Shall attend upon the judges, furnish them with Award books and ribbons and afford them the information necessary to discharge of their duties and to see that ribbons are properly presented to the prize exhibits and in cases of disputes, shall certify to the correctness and identity of the awards.
6. Shall sign the Award Book co-jointly with the judges.
7. Shall arrange amongst themselves for the constant and effective supervision of their section, the behaviour of the attendants and employees and the comfort and convenience of both exhibitors and the public.
8. Shall, in case they think advisable, to reject any exhibit, take immediate action and report to the Secretary.
9. Shall carefully explain to the Judges, the conditions of the competition in the class they are judging.
10. Return the Judge's Books, fully completed and signed by the Judge to the Secretary.

REGULATIONS OF THE WALGETT SHOW SOCIETY

1. All exhibits, except where otherwise stated, must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and no exhibitor will be allowed to compete or form part of any exhibit, for more than one prize, except Champion Prize, in the several horse prizes which are specified or as may be determined by the Committee from time to time.
2. All entries must be in the hands of the Secretary on a date to be fixed by the Society and such date is to be published in the Society's Schedule each year.
3. Cattle exhibits must be on the ground by 7.30 a.m. on the day of the Show that judging is taking place.
4. Champions are to be selected from prize winners, where two or more classes are provided.
5. The judge may refuse to award a prize where an exhibit is deemed unworthy and has the power if he/she is deemed unworthy and has the power if he/she desires to do so, to transfer any exhibit into the class he/she considers it belongs.
6. No exhibit will be allowed to be removed from the ground without permission of the Stewards of a class to which the exhibit belongs.
7. Exhibitors of cattle, horses, sheep or dogs must at the time of entry, state the age of any exhibit in years and months (if possible, up to the date of the Show). Breed, breeder (if known), manner of feeding or housing (if any) as regards to sheep and the date of when last shorn, the Committee shall have the power to disqualify an entry not complying with the conditions of its class.
8. When a pair is mentioned, exhibits may be mixed sexes.
9. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by an exhibit and it shall be a condition of entry that such exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accidents. Waiver forms must be signed for all entries.
10. The Society will not, under any circumstances, hold itself responsible for any mis-delivery of stock or other exhibits at the Society's exhibition or any damage thereto.
11. The Committee reserves the right to cancel or postpone the Show indefinitely.
12. Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, the Society reserves the right of refusing admittance to or removing same from the grounds at the expense of the exhibitor.
13. The Committee reserves the right of adjudicating on any questionable entry or any other point which may be raised and not specially provided for in the Rules, Regulations and By-Laws of the Society.
14. All persons causing annoyance, loud comments on the decisions of the Judges or unseemly or insulting behaviours, will after having been cautioned by a member of the Committee or the Secretary, be expelled from the Showground.
15. In the event of any prize in the schedule being provided for by private contribution, it shall take place of the Society's prize if the Committee so determines.
16. Protests must be lodged in writing within one hour of the event or within three events and must be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 which will be forfeited if such protest is deemed frivolous.
17. The persons exhibiting, shall accept the decision of the Judges appointed by the Society and on all protests, the decision of the Committee shall be final and without appeal.
18. No collection for charitable or other purposes will be allowed to be taken up on the Ground without the consent of the Committee.
19. The decision of the Committee on all points shall be final and without appeal.
20. Entry Fee must accompany all entries, otherwise they will not be received.
21. Entry Fee is to be fixed by the Committee and published in the Schedule.
22. In horse events, any competitors who have won an Open Championship are obliged to be present for the Supreme Championship.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

1. The Ringmaster and/or Chief Stewards reserve the right to alter events and/or programs as may be necessary.
2. Swabbing of horses may be done at any time at the discretion of the Ringmaster, Judges or Stewards.
3. Outside assistance to competitors by word, by radio or any other method in Horse Ring Events will NOT be tolerated. If in breach of this ruling, competitors and their exhibits may be dismissed from the event and from the Showground. Competitor's names will be submitted to the ASC.

IMPORTANT – Every endeavour has been made in compiling a timetable to avoid the judging of two classes concurrently in which one exhibitor may be interested and every consideration will be given to competitors who compete in both events, but as this may at times prove impossible, the Committee will therefore be appreciative if competitors will accept this possibility when making entries.

Prize money for ring events (except Showjumping) will be paid after events. Showjumping prize money will be paid at the end of Showjumping events and may be collected at the Secretary's Office. Trophies for Supreme Rider, Supreme Ridden Exhibit and B.T. Howard Memorial Open Stock Horse will be presented in the ring after each event. Any competitors unsure of eligibility for the following trophies or collecting Champion and Reserve Champion prize money (where applicable) are advised to please enquire at the Mobile Office.

MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR IN RING EVENTS

Prize Money: \$50.00. **Donated by the English family.**

Must nominate both horse and rider as a block entry at the Mobile Office before competing in the first event.

- a) Each block entry can only have one rider
- b) Eligibility for this trophy are those exhibitors who OWN one or more horses.
- c) All horses must be ridden by the owner or the one nominated.
- d) The named rider is the only eligible rider for all horses nominated by the exhibitor.
- e) Only results from A & B Rings and Sporting events eligible for this Trophy.
- f) Jumping and led classes not eligible for his Trophy. Points allocated must go to the owner and not the nominated rider.

MOST SUCCESSFUL FAMILY IN RING EVENTS

Any competitor unsure of eligibility of rules, please enquire at the Mobile Office. Those who compete in this trophy must nominate as a block entry at the Mobile Office before competing in their first event.

Eligibility for the event states:

- a) Parent/parents and children 16 years and under
- b) Parent/parents must be active competitors'
- c) Entry must be in the name of the parent/parents and child/children.
- d) Led classes not eligible for this trophy.

INFORMATION REGARDING EQUINE INFLUENZA & HENDRA VIRUS

- even though Hendra is rare, know the signs and what to do if you suspect infection and prevent horses from eating feed or drinking water that may be contaminated by body fluids from fruit bats roosting, feeding or flying overhead

Before travelling to Walgett Show:

- take your own feed and buckets for water and feed
- clean horse transport with disinfectant or soap
- don't bring horses that are sick or off colour

At the event:

- waiver forms must be signed and details of all horses completed (name, owner, microchip/ registration number/ horse description, PIC number and last event attended) – wristbands will be given out to show competitor has completed and signed the form and registered all horses AND MUST BE WORN BE TO BE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE
- monitor horse health daily
- don't share equipment between horses
- wash your hands before & after handling horses
- handle sick horses last or use separate staff
- isolate sick and "in-contact" horses at first sign of illness, report to event organisers and notify a vet immediately
- avoid all contact with other people's horses while at the event and restrict other people from touching yours.

ENTRY FEE - A, B and C Rings: \$2 coin, unless otherwise stated. NO block entry for Showjumping events.

All horses competing to be on the ground by 8.00 AM in case of program change. Winners will be awarded Society ribbons at the discretion of the Judge, in addition to prize money.

PONIES: not exceeding 14 hands

GALLOWAY: over 14 hands and not exceeding 15 hands

HACK: over 15 hands

SHOW HUNTER: competitors CANNOT compete in the Open Led and Open Hack classes.

AHHA MEMBERS SHOW HUNTER CLASSES: competitors must be a current financial AHHA member to be eligible.

(see the Australian Hunter Horse Association website for further details).

NOVICE: horse has not won a Championship at an Agricultural Show.

INTERMEDIATE: horse has not won 1st, 2nd or 3rd place at any Royal or Horse of the Year Show.

NEWCOMER HACK: horse has not been shown under saddle (racing excepted) prior to 1st January in its first year of being shown. Once shown under saddle, such horse ceases to be a Newcomer on 31st December that same year. All horses in Newcomer classes shall be shown in a snaffle bit (Show Hunters ARE eligible to compete).

CHILD'S HACK: rider must be under 17 years (ASH Hack under 17 years).

ADULT'S HACK: rider must be 17 years and over.

EDUCATED HACK: examples may include ability to side pass, rein back, walk-through change etc. All of the requirements of the show hack are the same i.e. quality, presence etc.

PLEASURE HACK: to be ridden in a snaffle bit, with only one hand on the reins, where safe to do so. No whips, spurs or drop nose bands.

Walgett Show Society will only accept measuring on Official Cards. Horses will be measured on request. Riders under 17 years of age must compete only in their respective age groups. Lady riders and Gentleman Riders are 17 years and over.

Eligibility to compete in breed classes: competitors must hold current membership of the relevant breed association to be eligible to compete. Proof of registration/membership must be provided to the Stewards on the day, on request.

ONE RIDER, ONE HORSE IN CHAMPIONSHIPS EVENTS.

MOST SUCCESSFUL BOY: donated by the English family for boy 16 years and under for gaining the most points in ring events. Led classes not eligible for this prize. PRIZE MONEY: \$50.00.

MOST SUCCESSFUL GIRL: donated by S & M Barrett for girl 16 years and under for gaining the most points in ring events. Led classes not eligible for this prize. PRIZE MONEY: \$50.00.

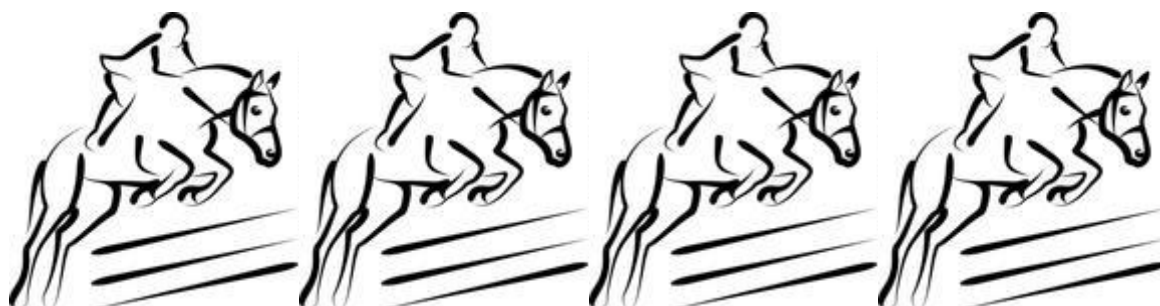
