Requirements for the Exhibitors in the Pavilion

ATTENTION: In case of breakages and/or damage, all articles must be returned promptly to the Secretary's Office with a written and signed "Please explain"

1. Name and address should be clearly marked on all parcels left at or sent to the Pavilion or Secretary's Office and each exhibit should be marked with name, section and class. The show secretary or stewards will ticket and number the exhibits.
2. All entry fees are 50c (fifty cents) with the exception of children's sections. Prize money \$2.00 unless otherwise stated. Limit of \$5.00 Entry Fee in any section.
3. A Waiver Form must be signed by all exhibitors.
4. **Please read the schedule carefully to find out closing dates for each section, as all sections are different.**
5. Stewards' discretion only to change entry classes.
6. Any article having won first prize at the Walgett Show, is not eligible for showing at future Walgett Shows.
7. Every possible care will be taken by the stewards throughout the Show, but the responsibility for exhibits must remain with the exhibitor.
8. No exhibits may be taken down by owners. The stewards will remove them on the second day of the Show and they may be collected from the Gordon Pavilion after 2.30pm, Leonard Pavilion, after 2.30pm. Stewards (or their representative) to be in the building from 2.00pm and doors will be closed until exhibits are available for collection.
9. **The Walgett Show Society accepts no responsibility for any articles left in the Pavilions after 3.30pm on the second day of the Show. Cakes and flowers will be left in pavilion and may be discarded after 4.00pm if not collected.**
10. Prize money will be paid by the Secretary at the Office. Early collection of prizes would be appreciated. Prize money not collected 2 months after the Show will revert to Show funds.
11. Special classes are only for disabled and handicapped persons.
12. Major trophies will be presented at the entrance of the Gordon Pavilion at **11.00am** on the second day of the Show. Other trophies may be collected on collection of exhibits.

13. **PAVILION WILL CLOSE AT 6.00pm ON FIRST DAY OF SHOW.**
14. Any work not deemed to be fit by the stewards will be rejected.
15. A class will be made available for any article presented to the stewards where provisions are not already made available in the schedule.

Exhibitors wishing to collect their flowers at the end of the Show must notify the steward at the time of entering the exhibit.** Exhibits to be grown by the exhibitor in the cut flower section. Entry of exhibits at the Showground 10 AM – 12 PM Friday 12th May (or Wed 10th – Thurs 11th May 9 am – 5 pm, at exhibitor's discretion, with judging on Friday 12th May).

HINTS FOR SHOWING CUT FLOWERS: a rose should, if possible, have a long strong stem with healthy foliage (preference two sets of leaves) and the bloom, with no side bud, should look up. A rose in full bloom should show a stamen. Rose of any other colour, is mauve, apricot, gold or multi-coloured. Rose in three stages, bud should show very little colour, next rose half open and three quarters open to full bloom, on separate stems.

HINTS FOR SHOW COOKING. But not necessarily the rules

Different judges have different ideas. First, read carefully the general instructions in Section M, then the particular instructions in the class entered and do as DIRECTED. Read the helpful hints in your recipe book.

For Jams & Preserves make sure your jars are clean. Check under lids for mould. Cakes should have a fresh appearance with no holes. Fruit Cake 250gm mixture will measure approx. 22cms round tin or 19cm square tin. Patty Cakes, no paper cases. Scones should be light and cut with sharp knife or cutter. Pikelets, when included in classes, should be evenly browned and measure about 5 cm across. Line or grease cooking tins carefully. It is better NOT to scrape the last bit of mixture from the mixing dish when cooking for exhibition.

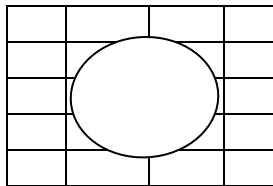

HINTS FOR PRESENTATION OF CROCHET

- No backing to be put on crocheted articles
- Please supply label from yarn used, attached to inside of article
- Fine crocheting yarns numbers #10, #12, #20, #30, #40, #50, #60, #80, #100 (being the finest)
- Thicker crocheting yarns numbered: 3ply, 5ply, 8ply
- Crocheting presents best if it is **blocked**. To do this, the article should be dampened and then pinned out to the measurements specified in the pattern. Woollen articles should be pressed carefully and then gently pulled into shape, before being stitched together. This also applies to knitted items
- The best way to block any article is shown below.

For circular items draw a circle on board, centre work and pin edges out to edges of circle (see next page):



Blocking Board: Cover with fabric and mark in equal parts. Remember to sew loose ends into the back of the work and snip off. No knots – it is easier and quicker to join a new thread on as you work and sew in the threads later. The judge will be looking for evenness of tension, workmanship and presentation.
